2021 Competitive Junior Tennis In The United States **Net Generation** PlayTracker (For 10 and Under)

The United States Tennis Association (USTA) divides competitive junior tennis into <u>four</u> general playing parts: 1). <u>Junior Team Tennis</u>; 2. <u>Junior Tournament Tennis</u>; 3). <u>Team Challenge Events</u> and 4). <u>USTA Junior Circuit Events</u>.

The <u>10 and under players</u> are tracked by <u>PlayTracker</u> which daily keeps track of their competitive play. Players are given <u>participation points (100)</u> for entering a tournament and <u>100 points</u> for winning a singles match and 50 doubles. A player may win up to 400 points in any single tournament. There are no ranking lists for the 10's. Age Categories

- 5-7 playing with red balls is recommended but not required.
- 7-8 play with orange balls (after accumulating 1,000 points or after being evaluated by your official USPTA or PTR coach you may move to green dot)
- 9-10 plays with green dot balls (must reach 1,500 points to move to yellow ball)
- *1,000 pts. must come from match wins More Details Net Generation PlayTracker Note: In the month juniors reach 11, 13, 15 and 17 they must play the next higher age category (12's,14's, 16's & 18's) using yellow balls. BG = Boys and Girls.

As of 2017, for safety reasons if your child is 14 and under, a parent profile account must be set up to link to the child. The parent obtains USTA junior membership and sets up the account at **www.usta.com**.

- 1. Get a USTA Junior Membership after the parent sets up an account.
- 2. Go to www.usta.com / click on youth / click on play / click on Junior
 Team Tennis. Note: Get your team number from the coach. Now Login/Register to Play. Note: We are the Midwest Section & S.E.Mich District (Example)
- *** Signing Up To Play USTA Junior Tournament Tennis (7-6-5-4-3-2-1 levels)
- Level 7-6 (Low Intermed.-intermed.) / Level 5-4 (high intermed-advance) / Level 3-1 (advance-highest skill))
 1. Get a USTA Junior Membership/Set up a parent profile account to link to child.
- 2. Go to www.usta.com / click on youth / click on play / click on Tournaments.
- Search by <u>Section</u> and <u>District.</u> Select <u>age</u> category, <u>time period</u> and <u>level</u>.

 * <u>Signing Up For Team Challenge Events</u> (Varying novice skills and ball types)
- 1. Go to www.usta.com /click on youth / click on play / click on Section and District and time period. Purpose expose juniors to fun, informal play where they may play with friends and others.
- * Signing Up For USTA Junior Circuit Events (Introductory level competition) Go to www.usta.com /click on youth/play/tournaments/section/district/ listed below level 7. These are usually two-four hour events using orange, green dot or yellow balls. They can be of different age categories.

Remember there are "standing lists" and "ranking lists" for players in the 12-18 ages.

Standing List-Bi-weekly rolling list based on play last year and currently in more than one age category.

Ranking List-Based on play Jan.1-Dec.31. (Youtube-USTA Ranking Pts For Jrs. - posted by Serve Tennis)
